#### **NOTES**

1. You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that the charity reclaims on your donations in the tax year (in 2003-04 – 28p for each £1 you give).
2. You can cancel this declaration at any time by notifying the net.
3. If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax that the net reclaims, you can cancel your declaration (see note 1).
4. If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your Self-Assessment tax return.
5. If you are unsure whether your donations qualify for Gift Aid tax relief, ask the net. Or ask your local tax office for leaflet IR 65.
6. Please notify the net if you change your name or address.
